She co-founded Hoosier Interfaith Power & Light; founded Solarize Indiana, which increased residential solar in Indiana by 20% in six months; and founded The Seventh Day Initiative, which assisted congregations and their members to become models of deep energy conservation by reducing their energy use by 33%. Madi now directs Creation Care Partners, which mobilizes synagogues and Evangelical churches across Indiana to install solar and deeply reduce their energy use.
